(herein called "Recipient" whether one or more) and United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), pursuant to the rules and regulations of the Secretary of Labor (herein called the 'Secretary') issued under the authority of Executive Order 11246 as amended, witnesseth:

In consideration of financial assistance (whether by a loan, grant, loan guaranty, or other form of financial assistance) made or to be made by the USDA to Recipient, Recipient hereby agrees, if the cash cost of construction work performed by Recipient or a construction contract financed with such financial assistance exceeds \$10,000 - unless exempted by rules, regulations or orders of the Secretary of Labor issued pursuant to Section 204 of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965.

1. To incorporate or cause to be incorporated into any contract for construction work, or modification thereof, subject to the relevant rules, regulations, and orders of the Secretary or of any prior authority that remain in effect, which is paid for in whole or in part with the aid of such financial assistance, the following "Equal Opportunity Clause":

During the performance of this contract, the contractor agrees as follows:

- (a) The contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex or national origin. The contractor will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, color, religion, sex or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited, to the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided by the USDA setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.
- (b) The contractor will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex or national origin.
- (c) The contractor will send to each labor union or representative of workers with which he has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice, to be provided by the USDA, advising the said labor union or workers' representative of the contractor's commitments under this agreement and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.
- (d) The contractor will comply with all provisions of Executive Order 11246 of September 24,1965, and of all rules, regulations and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor.
- (e) The contractor will furnish all information and reports required by Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, rules, regulations, and orders, or pursuant thereto, and will permit access to his books, records, and accounts by the USDA Civil Rights Office, and the Secretary of Labor for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with such rules, regulations, and orders.
- (f) In the event of the contractor's noncompliance with the nondiscrimination clauses of this contract or with any of the said rules, regulations, or orders, this contract may be cancelled, terminated, or suspended in whole or in part and the contractor may be declared ineligible for further Government contracts or federally assisted construction contracts in accordance with procedures authorized in Executive Order No. 11246 of September 24, 1965, and such other sanctions may be imposed and remedies invoked as provided in Executive Order No. 11246 of September 24, 1965, or by rule, regulation or order of the Secretary of Labor, or as otherwise provided by Law.
- (g) The contractor will include the provisions of paragraph 1 and paragraph (a) through (g) in every subcontract or purchase order, unless exempted by the rules, regulations, or orders of the Secretary of Labor issued pursuant to Section 204 of Executive Order No. 11246 of September 24, 1965, so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor. All bidders must comply with the bid conditions contained in the invitation to be considered responsible bidders and hence eligible for the award.

5. To assist and cooperate actively with USDA and the Secretary in obtaining the compliance of contractors and subcontractors with the equal opportunity clause and rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary, that will furnish USDA and the Secretary such information such as , but not limited to, Form AD-560, Certification of Nonsegregated Facilities, to submit the Monthly Employment Utilization Report, Form CC-257, as they may require for the supervision of such compliance, and that it will otherwise assist USDA in the discharge of USDA's primary responsibility for securing compliance.

6. To refrain from entering into any contract or contract modification subject to such Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, with a contractor debarred from, or who has not demonstrated eligibility for, Government contracts and Federally assisted construction contracts pursuant to the Executive Order and will carry out such sanctions and penalties for violation of the equal opportunity clause as may be imposed upon contractors and subcontractors by USDA or the Secretary of Labor pursuant to Part II, Subpart D, of the Executive Order.

INTRODUCTION AND OBJECTIVE:

Four County Electric Membership Corporation (Four County EMC) has played an active role in the development of rural North Carolina. Through its board and staff, the Four County EMC has provided not only leadership but financial participation in economic and community development. Now, through the creation of a Revolving Loan Fund (RLF), the Four County EMC is seeking to improve the quality of life in rural areas by contributing to the long-term improvement in the economy, including job creation and retention, diversification of the economy, improving the education and skills of the rural workforce, and upgrading the public infrastructure to improve the health, safety, and/or medical care of rural residents.

POLICY STATEMENTS:

- The Four County EMC will accept and consider applications for loans from the RLF for projects that will significantly benefit rural areas, without restriction to the Four County EMC's service area.
- The RLF seeks to minimize its financial participation in all projects. The RLF is not intended to compete with other public and private lenders. The RLF will collaborate with other lenders to provide the financial package necessary to advance the project, but at the same time to minimize the RLF financing component.
- The Board of Directors of the Four County EMC is the sole authority for approval or denial of loans from the RLF and is responsible for all decisions and actions of the RLF. The RLF will be operated and maintained solely by the Four County EMC.
- To avoid potential conflicts of interest, or the appearance of a conflict of interest, an RLF loan will not be made to any board member, officer, general manager, or supervisory employee of the Four County EMC or close relative thereof, or to any Four County EMC subsidiary or affiliated organization in which the Four County EMC has a financial interest.
- The Four County EMC will not condition the approval of a loan from the RLF with the requirement that the prospective recipient purchase electrical or telephone service from the Four County EMC or any other electrical/telephone utility.
- Amendments to this Rural Development Plan will require the approval of the Four County EMC board of directors. However, no action will be taken to amend this plan without the prior written approval of the Rural Business Cooperative Service (RBS), its successors or assigns.
- The Four County EMC RLF is an equal opportunity lender and requires loan recipients to adhere to all equal opportunity laws.
- All information regarding RLF loan requests will at all times be kept confidential by the members of the Four County EMC board, the loan review committee, and Four County EMC staff. If necessary, the RLF may seek the advice and counsel of outside consultants and sources in order to adequately perform due diligence regarding the project.

REVOLVING LOAN FUND MANAGEMENT:

Administration of the Revolving Loan Fund

Management of the RLF will be "in house" by Four County EMC staff in addition to their regular responsibilities, although other community resources may be used. If third party contracts are used for administration, review and approval of contracts by USDA Rural Development is required. With prior written approval of RBS, up to, but, not more than 10% of the grant funds received shall be used for RLF administration.

Loan Review Committee

The Four County EMC board of directors has appointed a Loan Review Committee (LRC), consisting of both cooperative and community leaders, to review all RLF loan applications. The LRC will perform necessary credit analysis and due diligence in order to make a written recommendation to the Four County EMC board of directors, which has final authority regarding all actions of the RLF. The LRC will meet on an as needed basis under the terms of the application procedures listed below.

The Loan Review Committee serves on a volunteer basis. The LRC will have a minimum of 3 members and a maximum of 7 members. If a member of the LRC has a financial interest in the project being reviewed, he/she will abstain from the loan review/recommendation to the Four County EMC Board of Directors. Members of the LRC will serve indefinite terms. However, the Four County EMC board of directors has the right to replace members of the LRC in the event of resignation or other necessary circumstances.

The Loan Review Committee members were chosen, in part, because of their experience with lending and/or economic and community development projects. Initial members of the Loan Review Committee are:

A current and up to date roster of the members of the LRC will be attached to this Rural Development Plan as new members are appointed. These committee appointments do not reflect an amendment to the RLF Plan and therefore do not have to be approved by USDA.

REVOLVING LOAN FUND GUIDELINES

Initial Loan

The initial loan of "Federal Funds" can be made to eligible entities for qualifying community development or community facility projects in rural areas of the State of North Carolina.

Eligible entities for initial funds include: non-profit organizations, public bodies, or Federally-recognized Indian Tribes.

Qualifying projects include community development or community facility projects which correspond to one or more of the following targets:

- a. Create or save employment; are open to and serve all rural residents; and are owned by the ultimate recipient of funds.
- b. Business Incubators.
- c. Facilities and equipment which provide education and training to residents of rural areas which will facilitate economic development.
- d. Facilities and equipment to provide medical care to residents of rural areas.
- e. Projects that utilize advanced telecommunications or computer networks to facilitate medical or education services or job training.
- f. Project feasibility studies and technical assistance.

For Profit entities are eligible for intial funds only if the project meets items c-f above.

Interest Rate: The initial loan of the Federal Funds will be made at zero percent.

Administration Fee: An annual loan servicing fee of up to 1% of the unpaid principal loan balance may be charged for loan administration.

Subsequent Loans / Revolved RLF Funds:

In general, eligible projects for subsequent loans can include any business venture, governmental public body, or non-profit entity involved in a community or economic development project that creates or saves jobs and/or provides needed community facilities that benefit rural areas in the State of North Carolina.

Eligible Applicants include:

- Corporations
- o Limited Liability Companies
- Partnerships
- Sole Proprietorships
- Cooperatives
- Nonprofit Entities
- Governmental Units, including: Local Townships, Municipalities, County Government, Regional Authorities, School Districts, and City or County Hospitals
- Federally-recognized Tribal Authorities

Application projects must create or retain employment or provide needed community facilities and services such as:

- Industrial/Commercial Development
- Small Business Expansion or Startup
- Business Incubators
- o Community Infrastructure
- Community Facilities
- Medical Facilities
- Training/Educational Facilities
- 0 Tourism

Loan Purposes

Uses of RLF loan proceeds may be for land, buildings, manufacturing machinery and equipment, office and work equipment or infrastructure improvements. Working capital loans will only be considered in conjunction with the purchase of other assets as previously specified.

Special Loan Limits-Residential Housing Projects

Recognizing the link between economic development, workforce availability and housing development and in accordance with USDA program limits, up to 20% of the RLF (an amount equal to the Four County EMC "matching funds") may be used for residential housing projects. Please note, consumer financing of a residence is not permitted.

In-Eligible Uses of RLF Funding:

- Refinancing of existing debt, or payment to business owners or partners;
- Activities determined to be for investment purposes;
- General improvement loans related to normal replacement needs of a business and unrelated to business expansion/job creation;
- Projects that would result in the transfer of existing employment or business activity more than 25 miles from its existing location;
- Agricultural production except where the project is a farmer-owned cooperative or similar, and the agriculture production is part of an integrated business that processes the agriculture products, and the agriculture production portion of the loan will not exceed 50% of the loan amount;
- Projects that are primarily working capital with limited security;
- Construction projects of an individual residential nature;
- Vehicles used for general purposes or that may be considered for personal use;
- Illegal activities and legalized activities (e.g. gambling casinos) that in the opinion of the Board of Directors adversely affect RLF interests;
- Projects in which any director, officer, general manager, or supervisory employee of the Intermediary, or close relative thereof, has a financial interest; projects in which any subsidiary or affiliated organization of Intermediary has a financial interest; or projects which, based on the judgment of the Board, would create a conflict of interest, potential for conflict of interest, or any appearance of a conflict of interest.

Minimum / Maximum Loan Amounts

The minimum RLF loan will be \$_____ and the maximum RLF Loan will be \$_____. (or alternative maximum language: ...the maximum RFL loan will be the total amount of funds available in the RLF.)

Supplemental Financing Requirements (if desired for revolved loans)

RLF projects must include a minimum of 20% funding from other sources. Greater leveraging of outside resources will enhance the approvability of an RLF loan request.

Interest Rate

Interest rates on all subsequent RLF loans will not exceed the prevailing prime rate as published in the Wall Street Journal on the day of loan closing and will be determined based on the evaluation of the applicant's ability to repay and the necessity of below market financing to advance the project. Interest earned on any RLF loan must stay in the fund for use in making additional RLF loans.

Administration Fee

In addition to the interest rate charged, an annual loan servicing fee of up to 1% of the unpaid principal loan balance may be charged for loan administration. However, this fee must be specified in the Loan Agreement signed at closing.

Closing Costs / "Out of Pocket" Expenses

The RLF may charge loan recipients for loan closing costs, attorney's fees, filing fees, etc., as necessary to complete loan documentation. All loan fees will be addressed in the Loan Agreement between the RLF and the loan recipient.

Loan Terms

The term of an RLF loan shall not exceed 10 years, and may be less than 10 years as determined by the Four County EMC Board. Loan deferments of up to 2 years may be considered on a project-by-project basis, but, are not encouraged.

The Loan Review Committee will make a recommendation concerning the term of the loan and payment frequency (monthly, quarterly, etc.) depending upon project need, the expected life of the security, and the applicant's ability to repay. The term of the loan will not exceed the expected life of the asset being used as collateral.

While not mandatory requirements, the following maturities will be used as a general guideline:

Building	10 Years
Real Estate	10 years
Equipment	2 to 7 Years
Computers	2 Years

Security / Collateral

The Intermediary will work with the potential loan recipient to obtain security that is adequate for the term of the loan. The nature of the collateral pledged shall be determined by the loan committee on a project-by-project basis. If the same collateral is used in joint financing, the RLF will seek a parity position with other lenders. Types of security may include:

- Mortgage Lien on Real Property
- Machinery and equipment which have a developed market;
- Letter(s) of credit from acceptable financial institution(s);
- Securities issued by the Federal government or its agencies.
- o Accounts receivable and inventory for short-term loans; and
- o Irrevocable letters of credit in the amount of the loan

The loan recipient will be required to maintain fire insurance, and flood insurance if necessary, on secured assets. In some cases, credit life or key man insurance will be required with the RLF as loss payee.

Personal guarantees from partners, directors or majority stockholders may be required for all corporate or partnership borrowings.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES

All applicants for RLF funding will be required to complete an application form and provide a corresponding business plan with verifiable data which demonstrates that their proposed projects are economically feasible, sustainable, and will provide benefits to rural areas, either through job creation or infrastructure improvements. A copy of the application which includes a list on supporting information is attached to this plan.

- 1. Applications will be accepted for review when the RLF has a minimum balance of \$25,000.
- 2. Applications will be accepted at the Four County EMC office during normal business hours. The Four County EMC is located at 1822 NC Highway 53 West, Burgaw, North Carolina 28425.
- 3. (Staff position) of the Four County EMC will review applications for completeness and present complete applications to the loan review committee. An application is not considered complete until all required information has been submitted to the Four County EMCstaff as listed on the attached application.
- 4. The loan review committee will analyze each project and make a written recommendation to the Four County EMC board of directors.
- 5. The Four County EMC Board of Directors will normally review RLF applications at their scheduled monthly Board Meeting. However, if needed and at the Board's option, the Board may call a special meeting to review a loan application.
- 6. The Four County EMC board of directors shall have final authority to approve or deny RLF loan requests, and to determine appropriate terms and conditions.
- 7. For approved loans, a loan agreement addressing all of the terms and conditions, including monitoring procedures, repayments, delinquencies, defaults and remedies for that project will be prepared by the RLF. In addition, the RLF shall have prepared all notes, mortgages, security agreements, UCC filings and other legal documents necessary to close the loan. The

RLF will use appropriate note, mortgage, and other forms which are approved by the State of North Carolina Bar Association.

8. Before RLF funds can be disbursed to the loan recipient, all requirements and terms of the loan agreement must be met and supplemental financing as applicable must already be contributed or verified ready to contribute to the project.

Review Criteria

The basis for determining the eligibility/approvability, loan amount, interest rate, and terms and conditions of a revolving loan fund request, and general RLF operational procedures, are as follows:

The loan review committee and Four County EMC board will consider the financial need of the project, the probability of success, the security offered, and the overall benefits of the project to rural areas, including the number of jobs to be created or retained, diversification of the economy, the extent of the upgrading of the skills of the rural workforce, the quality of the jobs in terms of pay scale and benefit package, and, for community development projects, improvements to the community infrastructure, facilities, and/or acquisition of equipment that improves the education, health, safety, and/or medical care of rural residents.

Loan Monitoring

The Four County EMC board of directors and/or the loan review committee shall monitor all RLF loans to ensure that loan proceeds are spent as identified in the RLF application, that all other sources of financing have been committed to the project, and that the benefits of the project, such as job creation, are accomplished as stated in the RLF application. The Four County EMC board and/or LRC shall ensure that RLF lien positions and loan collateral are secure.

This loan monitoring will require regular reporting by the loan recipient.

Annual income statements and balance sheets will be collected from the loan recipient. Depending on the nature of the project and security arrangements, the Intermediary reserves the right to require the submission of annual financial reports as audited by a certified public accountant.

The Intermediary will also conduct periodic/annual site visits to meet with the loan recipient, verify collateral and collect any information as required.

At the option of the Intermediary, periodic management information reports may be required of the loan recipient. Management reports may be required on a semi-annual basis beginning six months after the advance of RLF funds and continuing semi-annually thereafter for a period of 3 years or until completion of the project, whichever is the later period. If requested, management reports will include:

- o information on the number of jobs created or retained during the reporting period;
- a comparison of accomplishments during the reporting period to the objectives established for the project,
- a description of any problems, delays, or adverse conditions which will materially affect the attainment of planned project objectives and a statement of action taken or contemplated to resolve the situation.

The Intermediary reserves the right to require these reports on a more frequent basis if it is determined to be in the best interest of the RLF.

An annual review and report of the outstanding loans of the RLF, including job creation/retention totals and community benefits, will be compiled by the loan committee for presentation to the Four County EMC board of directors.

Collection Procedures

The <u>RLF Staff position</u> is charged with the responsibility for loan collections and related workouts, collection of charged-off loans, management and disposal of other real estate owned and any other activities related to delinquent accounts.

As part of this responsibility, the <u>RLF Staff position</u> shall have authority to initiate foreclosures, and collection suits after consultation with the Four County EMC's legal counsel. The <u>RLF Staff</u> position will advise the board of such action at their next regular meeting.

- 1. Past due notices will be generated and sent to the loan recipient according to the following schedule:
 - First notice sent on the 10th day after a note or payment is due.
 - Second notice sent on the 20th day after a note or payment is due.
- 2. If the delinquent account becomes 30 days delinquent, <u>RLF Staff Position</u> will make phone contact with the loan recipient to inquire about the situation and arrange appropriate corrective action.
 - As a prudent lender and at the intermediary's sole discretion, a one-time corrective action/workout of a delinquent account is permitted. As part of the workout, loan terms may be modified by deferral, reamortization and/or balloon payments. However, the term of the modified loan can not exceed a 10 year period from the date of the original loan closing.
- 3. If the delinquent account is not taking steps to cure default and the account becomes 60 days delinquent, a written 30 day Notice to Cure will be issued and sent to the loan recipient via certified, first class mail with a return receipt requested.
- 4. If the delinquent account does not respond to the Notice to Cure by paying the amount stated in the cure notice, the file will be forwarded to Four County EMC's legal counsel to start foreclosure actions.
 - As mentioned earlier, up to 10% of Rural Development Grant funds may be applied toward operating expenses of the RLF over the life of the fund. Operating expenses include the costs of administering the RLF and technical assistance provided to loan recipients by independent providers. Under the authority of this section, costs of administering the RLF includes any costs related to collections and/or foreclosure of a delinquent account.
 - The Intermediary will maintain an aggregated total of any and all related collections / foreclosure costs which are charged against this 10% allowance.

File Retention

All RLF files will be retained for a period of not less than 3 full years after the loan has been paid in full. After 3 years, the files will be destroyed by shredding or incineration. Files will be secured in a locked, safe place and access will be limited to Intermediary staff with RLF responsibilities. Other security measures will be initiated as needed to protect confidentiality of loan documents.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) for Preparing the Preliminary Scopes of Work (Scope) for Asset Inventory and Assessment (AIA) Grants from The Division of Water Infrastructure (Division)

What is a Scope of Work for an AIA project?

- The Division of Water Infrastructure (Division) requires an approved Preliminary Scope of Work (Scope) prior to transmitting the formal Grant Offer to recipients of approved AIA grants (grantees).
- Scopes for AIA projects provide the Division with an overview of the project tasks, costs, timeline, and deliverables/recommendations used to direct disbursements.
- The Scope should be consistent with the activities or services described in the application that will address the challenges experienced by the utility. The scope should be consistent with the scope of work to which the grantee will agree to in an engineering contract.

How do I submit my AIA Scope?

- Scopes should be submitted by the grantee (not the consultant) via the Division's online portal to the Division's project manager identified in the project's Letter of Intent to Fund (LOIF), by the date indicated in the milestone schedule. Reference the Division's Project Number provided in the LOIF.
 - Form to upload documents: <u>https://edocs.deg.nc.gov/Forms/DW-Document-Upload-Form</u>
- The grantee's Authorized Representative (not the consultant) may request a modest extension of the submittal date via an email or letter on appropriate letterhead, sent to the Division's project manager. The request must include a justification for the delay and propose a new date for submitting the Scope.
- Prior to submitting your scope, contact your Division project manager regarding any anticipated changes to the project as described in the application.

What does DWI require in an AIA Scope?

- Scopes must be consistent with the project described in the approved funding application, including the budget and challenges described in the application narrative.
- Scopes must contain the following:
 - Anticipated activities and/or services to be performed during the AIA project
 - A concise narrative describing how each project activity addresses the challenges in the approved AIA application
 - The budget for each project activity
 - A schedule for completing the project within 24 months of the Letter of Intent to Fund
 - The deliverables to be produced for the project, including GIS shape files as applicable to the project

What are eligible AIA project Activities?

- Project activities should adhere to the Division's "Water and Wastewater Utility Evaluation Guidance Document: Asset Inventory and Assessment, Capital Cost, and Operating Cost Analyses" document, which primarily serves to help guide engineers and consultants during an AIA project. The latest version is posted to the Division's website (here).
- Regardless of eligibility, if the project includes activities NOT covered by the AIA grant, the Scope budget must distinguish (a) the activities (or a portion thereof) that will be funded by the AIA grant from (b) the activities (or a portion thereof) that will be funded outside of the AIA grant.
 - For example, a \$200,000 AIA project may receive \$150,000 in Division AIA grant funding. The budget table in the Scope should show one column for the costs and activities covered by the AIA grant (totaling \$150,000) and a separate column for the costs to be covered by the other funding source (totaling the remaining \$50,000), and also provide the source of the non-Division funding (i.e., local cash, USDA grant, etc.).
- If equipment is an integral part of your project, contact your Division project manager prior to submitting the scope.
 - Eligible equipment costs (tablets, computers, and asset management equipment) must comprise no more than 10 percent of the grant AND must be justified in the scope.
- If access to software is an integral part of your project, the initial purchase and/or subscription is eligible, but the renewal of software subscription is not eligible.

What is required for the Scope narrative?

- The Scope narrative should consist of a succinct discussion of each task. The description should explain how the tasks relate to the challenges and benefits identified in the application.
- Reference any applicable historic asset management work and describe how the proposed project Scope builds upon those past asset management efforts.
- Specify that any GIS data delivered to the grantee will be provided in a format they can easily and readily update with current resources, and clearly identify the owner of the data.
- Remember, the application was funded based on the specific needs of the system and proposed benefits of the AIA project.

What is required for the project schedule?

- The project schedule must show the anticipated start and end dates for each project activity.
- The final project completion date must be within 24 months of the date the Letter of Intent to Fund is sent to the applicant (this language is in the Letter of Intent to Fund). Typically, the Grant Offer will be issued within one month of scope approval.
- Specify that DWI will be copied on draft and final deliverables, including the appropriate GIS data

layers that show a complete service area boundary, including gaps within those boundaries.

• Provide regular (no less frequent than every other month unless otherwise directed by the Division) updates, preferably with the submittal of disbursement requests.

What makes up the Deliverable?

- The deliverable consists of the documents produced by the planning project. The documents may include, but are not limited to:
 - o photos
 - o maps
 - o outputs and summaries of models and/or flow monitoring
 - copies of physical CCTV inspections
 - o GIS data layers if applicable
 - Findings, recommendations, and/or conculsions
- Scopes must specify that both the draft and final deliverables will be submitted to the Division for review and approval prior to processing the final disbursement request.

What deliverables must be submitted to the Division?

- At the end of the AIA project, the grantee must submit to the Division a copy of the deliverable/report, an executive summary, and either:
 - A copy of the board meeting minutes where the report/recommendations were presented and the minutes of the subsequent board meeting showing adoption of the previous meeting's minutes, or
 - A resolution passed by the governing board adopting the findings/recommendations/conclusions presented in the report, including Capital Improvement Plans and adjoining rate studies as appropriate.
- The final report must be approved by the Division prior to final disbursement of the grant funds.
- For projects that develop a new or update an existing GIS database, GIS shapefiles and databases must be submitted to Division staff upon completion of the project. The shapefile should include the appropriate GIS data layers that show a complete service area boundary, including gaps within those boundaries, most commonly in the following file formats: .shp, .shx, and .dbf.
- Note that the data gathered during the Division-funded project is the property of the grantee; exceptions to grantee ownership of project deliverables, including incorporation of data into proprietary software, must be clarified in the scope.

What if my Local Government Unit (Unit) has been designated Distressed?

- Distressed Units are required to complete the activities established in NCGS §159G-45(b), and an AIA grant provides funding to fulfill some of those requirements.
- Remember, project activities should adhere to the Division's guidance document.
- Distressed Units are required to complete short-term and long-term plans for infrastructure

repair, maintenance, and management, of which a complete AMP and 10-year CIP are integral parts. AlA projects for distressed units must either:

- Result in a complete Asset Management Plan (AMP) including at least a 10-year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP), or
- Establish the basis of an AMP and a timeline for fulfilling all the activities required of distressed units.
- In general, a complete AMP consists of:
 - List of assets/asset registry
 - Spatial database/GIS map
 - A risk-based condition assessment of all water and/or wastewater assets
 - Minimum 10-year Capital Improvement Plan
 - Recommended schedule and plan for Operation, Maintenance and Rehabilitation/Replacement, including time/cost estimates for annual budgeting
 - Staffing plan to implement AMP/CIP, as needed
 - Rate study (minimum 5-year rate programming to address CIP)
- As stated in the LOIF for the AIA project, contact your Division project manager prior to creating the Scope to discuss how this project helps the Distressed Unit fulfill the statutory requirements in §159G-45(b) and make progress toward de-designation.
- For Distressed Units with an approved or draft Short-Term Action Plan as a result of meeting with Division staff, reference the action items identified in the plan in the project Scope.

Suggested Scope Format (Adobe PDF or other non-editable format)

Section 1 – Reference: Contact information for the grantee, contact information for the consultant, project name as listed in the application and the LOIF, funding cycle, etc.

Section 2 – Narrative: A concise narrative description of the Scope, referencing any applicable historic asset management efforts, describing how the proposed Scope builds on past efforts, and connecting the challenges described in the application with the main project activities.

Section 3 – Itemized Tasks: A description, cost, and schedule/timeline of each main project activity, detailed enough that the Division can determine the tasks that will be accomplished during the project, the resulting deliverable, and what is/is not eligible for disbursement.

Section 4 – Deliverables: A summary of the anticipated documents and plans to be created during the project with milestones, including a timeline for the Division to approve the draft and final deliverables, detailed enough that the Division can determine that the grantee will meet the funding requirements.

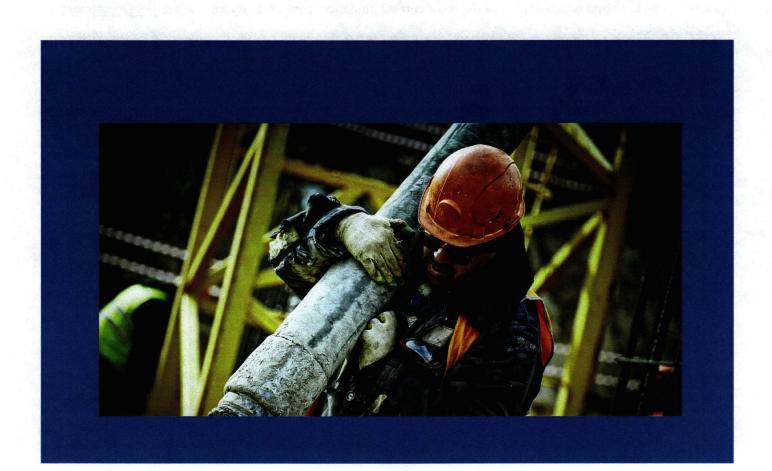

Preface

Subrecipients received funds from the North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) in the form of subawards, the purpose of which was to carry out a portion of NC DEQ's American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) State Fiscal Recovery Fund (SFRF) grant program in accordance with the applicable law.

As such, Subrecipients must carry out the responsibilities of their subawards in accordance with Section 602 of the Social Security Act (as added by section 9901(a) of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021), 31 C.F.R. Part 35 (U.S. Treasury's "Final Rule"), as well as any guidance provided by U.S. Treasury including, but not limited to, the CSLFRF Compliance and Reporting Guidance and U.S. Treasury's SLFRF Final Rule Frequently Asked Questions. Subrecipients must also comply with the applicable provisions of 2 C.F.R. Part 200 (the "Uniform Guidance"), as implemented by the U.S. Treasury under 2 C.F.R. Part 1000, and as set forth in the CSLFRF Assistance Listing 21.027.

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Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) for Preparing the Preliminary Scopes of Work (Scope) for Asset Inventory and Assessment (AIA) Grants from The Division of Water Infrastructure (Division)

What is a Scope of Work for an AIA project?

- The Division of Water Infrastructure (Division) requires an approved Preliminary Scope of Work (Scope) prior to transmitting the formal Grant Offer to recipients of approved AIA grants (grantees).
- Scopes for AIA projects provide the Division with an overview of the project tasks, costs, timeline, and deliverables/recommendations used to direct disbursements.
- The Scope should be consistent with the activities or services described in the application that will address the challenges experienced by the utility. The scope should be consistent with the scope of work to which the grantee will agree to in an engineering contract.

How do I submit my AIA Scope?

- Scopes should be submitted by the grantee (not the consultant) via the Division's online portal to the Division's project manager identified in the project's Letter of Intent to Fund (LOIF), by the date indicated in the milestone schedule. Reference the Division's Project Number provided in the LOIF.
 - Form to upload documents: <u>https://edocs.deg.nc.gov/Forms/DW-Document-Upload-Form</u>
- The grantee's Authorized Representative (not the consultant) may request a modest extension
 of the submittal date via an email or letter on appropriate letterhead, sent to the Division's
 project manager. The request must include a justification for the delay and propose a new
 date for submitting the Scope.
- Prior to submitting your scope, contact your Division project manager regarding any anticipated changes to the project as described in the application.

What does DWI require in an AIA Scope?

- Scopes must be consistent with the project described in the approved funding application, including the budget and challenges described in the application narrative.
- Scopes must contain the following:
 - Anticipated activities and/or services to be performed during the AIA project
 - A concise narrative describing how each project activity addresses the challenges in the approved AIA application
 - The budget for each project activity
 - A schedule for completing the project within 24 months of the Letter of Intent to Fund
 - The deliverables to be produced for the project, including GIS shape files as applicable to the project

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What are eligible AIA project Activities?

- Project activities should adhere to the Division's "Water and Wastewater Utility Evaluation Guidance Document: Asset Inventory and Assessment, Capital Cost, and Operating Cost Analyses" document, which primarily serves to help guide engineers and consultants during an AIA project. The latest version is posted to the Division's website (here).
- Regardless of eligibility, if the project includes activities NOT covered by the AIA grant, the Scope budget must distinguish (a) the activities (or a portion thereof) that will be funded by the AIA grant from (b) the activities (or a portion thereof) that will be funded outside of the AIA grant.
 - For example, a \$200,000 AIA project may receive \$150,000 in Division AIA grant funding. The budget table in the Scope should show one column for the costs and activities covered by the AIA grant (totaling \$150,000) and a separate column for the costs to be covered by the other funding source (totaling the remaining \$50,000), and also provide the source of the non-Division funding (i.e., local cash, USDA grant, etc.).
- If equipment is an integral part of your project, contact your Division project manager prior to submitting the scope.
 - Eligible equipment costs (tablets, computers, and asset management equipment) must comprise no more than 10 percent of the grant AND must be justified in the scope.
- If access to software is an integral part of your project, the initial purchase and/or subscription is eligible, but the renewal of software subscription is not eligible.

What is required for the Scope narrative?

- The Scope narrative should consist of a succinct discussion of each task. The description should explain how the tasks relate to the challenges and benefits identified in the application.
- Reference any applicable historic asset management work and describe how the proposed project Scope builds upon those past asset management efforts.
- Specify that any GIS data delivered to the grantee will be provided in a format they can easily and readily update with current resources, and clearly identify the owner of the data.
- Remember, the application was funded based on the specific needs of the system and proposed benefits of the AIA project.

What is required for the project schedule?

- The project schedule must show the anticipated start and end dates for each project activity.
- The final project completion date must be within 24 months of the date the Letter of Intent to Fund is sent to the applicant (this language is in the Letter of Intent to Fund). Typically, the Grant Offer will be issued within one month of scope approval.
- Specify that DWI will be copied on draft and final deliverables, including the appropriate GIS data

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layers that show a complete service area boundary, including gaps within those boundaries.

 Provide regular (no less frequent than every other month unless otherwise directed by the Division) updates, preferably with the submittal of disbursement requests.

What makes up the Deliverable?

- The deliverable consists of the documents produced by the planning project. The documents may include, but are not limited to:
 - o photos
 - o maps
 - o outputs and summaries of models and/or flow monitoring
 - o copies of physical CCTV inspections
 - GIS data layers if applicable
 - Findings, recommendations, and/or conculsions
- Scopes must specify that both the draft and final deliverables will be submitted to the Division for review and approval prior to processing the final disbursement request.

What deliverables must be submitted to the Division?

- At the end of the AIA project, the grantee must submit to the Division a copy of the deliverable/report, an executive summary, and either:
 - A copy of the board meeting minutes where the report/recommendations were presented and the minutes of the subsequent board meeting showing adoption of the previous meeting's minutes, or
 - A resolution passed by the governing board adopting the findings/recommendations/conclusions presented in the report, including Capital Improvement Plans and adjoining rate studies as appropriate.
- The final report must be approved by the Division prior to final disbursement of the grant funds.
- For projects that develop a new or update an existing GIS database, GIS shapefiles and databases must be submitted to Division staff upon completion of the project. The shapefile should include the appropriate GIS data layers that show a complete service area boundary, including gaps within those boundaries, most commonly in the following file formats: .shp, .shx, and .dbf.
- Note that the data gathered during the Division-funded project is the property of the grantee; exceptions to grantee ownership of project deliverables, including incorporation of data into proprietary software, must be clarified in the scope.

What if my Local Government Unit (Unit) has been designated Distressed?

- Distressed Units are required to complete the activities established in NCGS §159G-45(b), and an AIA grant provides funding to fulfill some of those requirements.
- Remember, project activities should adhere to the Division's guidance document.
- Distressed Units are required to complete short-term and long-term plans for infrastructure

repair, maintenance, and management, of which a complete AMP and 10-year CIP are integral parts. AIA projects for distressed units must either:

- Result in a complete Asset Management Plan (AMP) including at least a 10-year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP), or
- Establish the basis of an AMP and a timeline for fulfilling all the activities required of distressed units.
- In general, a complete AMP consists of:
 - List of assets/asset registry
 - Spatial database/GIS map
 - o A risk-based condition assessment of all water and/or wastewater assets
 - o Minimum 10-year Capital Improvement Plan
 - Recommended schedule and plan for Operation, Maintenance and Rehabilitation/Replacement, including time/cost estimates for annual budgeting
 - Staffing plan to implement AMP/CIP, as needed
 - Rate study (minimum 5-year rate programming to address CIP)
- As stated in the LOIF for the AIA project, contact your Division project manager prior to creating the Scope to discuss how this project helps the Distressed Unit fulfill the statutory requirements in §159G-45(b) and make progress toward de-designation.
- For Distressed Units with an approved or draft Short-Term Action Plan as a result of meeting with Division staff, reference the action items identified in the plan in the project Scope.

Suggested Scope Format (Adobe PDF or other non-editable format)

Section 1 – Reference: Contact information for the grantee, contact information for the consultant, project name as listed in the application and the LOIF, funding cycle, etc.

Section 2 – Narrative: A concise narrative description of the Scope, referencing any applicable historic asset management efforts, describing how the proposed Scope builds on past efforts, and connecting the challenges described in the application with the main project activities.

Section 3 – Itemized Tasks: A description, cost, and schedule/timeline of each main project activity, detailed enough that the Division can determine the tasks that will be accomplished during the project, the resulting deliverable, and what is/is not eligible for disbursement.

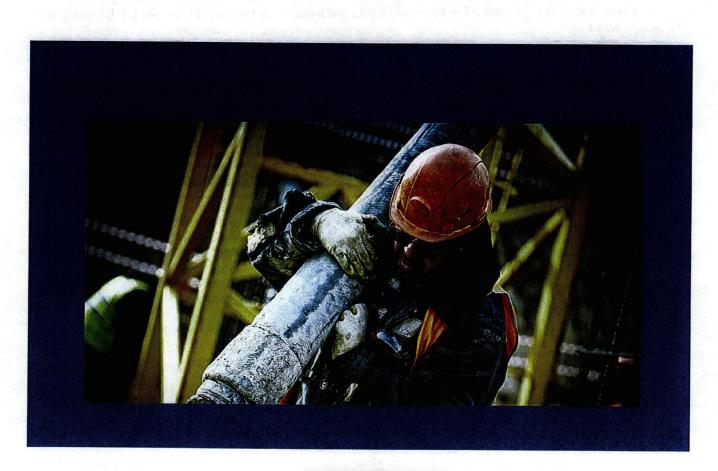
Section 4 – Deliverables: A summary of the anticipated documents and plans to be created during the project with milestones, including a timeline for the Division to approve the draft and final deliverables, detailed enough that the Division can determine that the grantee will meet the funding requirements.

Preface

Subrecipients received funds from the North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) in the form of subawards, the purpose of which was to carry out a portion of NC DEQ's American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) State Fiscal Recovery Fund (SFRF) grant program in accordance with the applicable law.

As such, Subrecipients must carry out the responsibilities of their subawards in accordance with Section 602 of the Social Security Act (as added by section 9901(a) of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021), 31 C.F.R. Part 35 (U.S. Treasury's "Final Rule"), as well as any guidance provided by U.S. Treasury including, but not limited to, the CSLFRF Compliance and Reporting Guidance and U.S. Treasury's SLFRF Final Rule Frequently Asked Questions. Subrecipients must also comply with the applicable provisions of 2 C.F.R. Part 200 (the "Uniform Guidance"), as implemented by the U.S. Treasury under 2 C.F.R. Part 1000, and as set forth in the CSLFRF Assistance Listing 21.027.

In addition to the federal requirements for ARPA/SFRF subawards, subrecipients must also comply with applicable state laws and regulations. For the most current guidance from Treasury, please see <u>US Department of Treasury_SLFRF</u>.

STANDARD ASSURANCES FOR AIA GRANTS

- 1. The Recipient acknowledges that no disbursements will be made until applicable service agreements or contracts are submitted. The description of work listed on invoices must be included in the scope of work shown on the agreements or contracts.
- 2. The Recipient is responsible for paying for ineligible project costs as determined by the Division.
- **3.** The Recipient agrees to establish and maintain a financial management system that adequately accounts for revenues and expenditures. Adequate accounting and fiscal records will be maintained during the construction of the project and these records will be retained and made available for a period of at least three (3) years following completion of the project.
- 4. All ARPA funds shall be expended solely for carrying out the approved project, and an audit shall be performed in accordance with G.S. 159-34. Partial disbursements will be made promptly upon request, subject to adequate documentation of incurred eligible costs, and subject to the Recipient's compliance with the Standard Conditions and Assurances of this Award. The Recipient agrees to make prompt payment to its contractor, and to retain only such amount as allowed by North Carolina General Statute. Requests for disbursements must be made using the Division's disbursement form.
- 5. All funds provided pursuant to North Carolina General Statute 159G must be expended solely for carrying out the approved project, and an audit shall be performed in accordance with G.S. 159-34, as amended. The Recipient must expend all of the requisitioned funds for the purpose of paying the costs of the project within three (3) banking days following the receipt of the funds from the State. Please note that the State is not a party to any contract(s) and the Recipient is expected to uphold its contract obligations regarding timely payment.
- 6. The Recipient must provide summaries of project progress every other month during the project or as otherwise directed by the Division.
- 7. The Recipient must provide a digital copy of the final report in a universally readable format. If a project includes updating or developing a GIS database or shapefiles, at a minimum the current utility service boundaries must be provided as a polygon shapefile, including any service gaps within the boundary.
- 8. The Recipient must provide an executive level summary of the work performed, any conclusions made, and the next steps to be taken as a result of this work.
- **9.** The Recipient must provide approved minutes or a resolution confirming the final report has been presented to the recipient's governing board.
- **10.** A maximum of 95% of the grant will be paid prior to receipt of the documentation described in Standard Assurance Nos. 7, 8, and 9. After receipt of this documentation, the final disbursement request will be processed.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) for Preparing the Preliminary Scopes of Work (Scope) for Asset Inventory and Assessment (AIA) Grants from The Division of Water Infrastructure (Division)

What is a Scope of Work for an AIA project?

- The Division of Water Infrastructure (Division) requires an approved Preliminary Scope of Work (Scope) prior to transmitting the formal Grant Offer to recipients of approved AIA grants (grantees).
- Scopes for AIA projects provide the Division with an overview of the project tasks, costs, timeline, and deliverables/recommendations used to direct disbursements.
- The Scope should be consistent with the activities or services described in the application that will address the challenges experienced by the utility. The scope should be consistent with the scope of work to which the grantee will agree to in an engineering contract.

How do I submit my AIA Scope?

- Scopes should be submitted by the grantee (not the consultant) via the Division's online portal to the Division's project manager identified in the project's Letter of Intent to Fund (LOIF), by the date indicated in the milestone schedule. Reference the Division's Project Number provided in the LOIF.
 - Form to upload documents: <u>https://edocs.deg.nc.gov/Forms/DW-Document-Upload-Form</u>
- The grantee's Authorized Representative (not the consultant) may request a modest extension of the submittal date via an email or letter on appropriate letterhead, sent to the Division's project manager. The request must include a justification for the delay and propose a new date for submitting the Scope.
- Prior to submitting your scope, contact your Division project manager regarding any anticipated changes to the project as described in the application.

What does DWI require in an AIA Scope?

- Scopes must be consistent with the project described in the approved funding application, including the budget and challenges described in the application narrative.
- Scopes must contain the following:
 - Anticipated activities and/or services to be performed during the AIA project
 - A concise narrative describing how each project activity addresses the challenges in the approved AIA application
 - The budget for each project activity
 - A schedule for completing the project within 24 months of the Letter of Intent to Fund
 - The deliverables to be produced for the project, including GIS shape files as applicable to the project

What are eligible AIA project Activities?

- Project activities should adhere to the Division's "Water and Wastewater Utility Evaluation Guidance Document: Asset Inventory and Assessment, Capital Cost, and Operating Cost Analyses" document, which primarily serves to help guide engineers and consultants during an AIA project. The latest version is posted to the Division's website (here).
- Regardless of eligibility, if the project includes activities NOT covered by the AIA grant, the Scope budget must distinguish (a) the activities (or a portion thereof) that will be funded by the AIA grant from (b) the activities (or a portion thereof) that will be funded outside of the AIA grant.
 - For example, a \$200,000 AIA project may receive \$150,000 in Division AIA grant funding. The budget table in the Scope should show one column for the costs and activities covered by the AIA grant (totaling \$150,000) and a separate column for the costs to be covered by the other funding source (totaling the remaining \$50,000), and also provide the source of the non-Division funding (i.e., local cash, USDA grant, etc.).
- If equipment is an integral part of your project, contact your Division project manager prior to submitting the scope.
 - Eligible equipment costs (tablets, computers, and asset management equipment) must comprise no more than 10 percent of the grant AND must be justified in the scope.
- If access to software is an integral part of your project, the initial purchase and/or subscription is eligible, but the renewal of software subscription is not eligible.

What is required for the Scope narrative?

- The Scope narrative should consist of a succinct discussion of each task. The description should explain how the tasks relate to the challenges and benefits identified in the application.
- Reference any applicable historic asset management work and describe how the proposed project Scope builds upon those past asset management efforts.
- Specify that any GIS data delivered to the grantee will be provided in a format they can easily and readily update with current resources, and clearly identify the owner of the data.
- Remember, the application was funded based on the specific needs of the system and proposed benefits of the AIA project.

What is required for the project schedule?

- The project schedule must show the anticipated start and end dates for each project activity.
- The final project completion date must be within 24 months of the date the Letter of Intent to Fund is sent to the applicant (this language is in the Letter of Intent to Fund). Typically, the Grant Offer will be issued within one month of scope approval.
- Specify that DWI will be copied on draft and final deliverables, including the appropriate GIS data

layers that show a complete service area boundary, including gaps within those boundaries.

• Provide regular (no less frequent than every other month unless otherwise directed by the Division) updates, preferably with the submittal of disbursement requests.

What makes up the Deliverable?

- The deliverable consists of the documents produced by the planning project. The documents may include, but are not limited to:
 - o photos
 - o maps
 - o outputs and summaries of models and/or flow monitoring
 - copies of physical CCTV inspections
 - o GIS data layers if applicable
 - Findings, recommendations, and/or conculsions
- Scopes must specify that both the draft and final deliverables will be submitted to the Division for review and approval prior to processing the final disbursement request.

What deliverables must be submitted to the Division?

- At the end of the AIA project, the grantee must submit to the Division a copy of the deliverable/report, an executive summary, and either:
 - A copy of the board meeting minutes where the report/recommendations were presented and the minutes of the subsequent board meeting showing adoption of the previous meeting's minutes, or
 - A resolution passed by the governing board adopting the findings/recommendations/conclusions presented in the report, including Capital Improvement Plans and adjoining rate studies as appropriate.
- The final report must be approved by the Division prior to final disbursement of the grant funds.
- For projects that develop a new or update an existing GIS database, GIS shapefiles and databases must be submitted to Division staff upon completion of the project. The shapefile should include the appropriate GIS data layers that show a complete service area boundary, including gaps within those boundaries, most commonly in the following file formats: .shp, .shx, and .dbf.
- Note that the data gathered during the Division-funded project is the property of the grantee; exceptions to grantee ownership of project deliverables, including incorporation of data into proprietary software, must be clarified in the scope.

What if my Local Government Unit (Unit) has been designated Distressed?

- Distressed Units are required to complete the activities established in NCGS §159G-45(b), and an AIA grant provides funding to fulfill some of those requirements.
- Remember, project activities should adhere to the Division's guidance document.
- Distressed Units are required to complete short-term and long-term plans for infrastructure

repair, maintenance, and management, of which a complete AMP and 10-year CIP are integral parts. AIA projects for distressed units must either:

- Result in a complete Asset Management Plan (AMP) including at least a 10-year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP), or
- Establish the basis of an AMP and a timeline for fulfilling all the activities required of distressed units.
- In general, a complete AMP consists of:
 - List of assets/asset registry
 - Spatial database/GIS map
 - o A risk-based condition assessment of all water and/or wastewater assets
 - Minimum 10-year Capital Improvement Plan
 - Recommended schedule and plan for Operation, Maintenance and Rehabilitation/Replacement, including time/cost estimates for annual budgeting
 - Staffing plan to implement AMP/CIP, as needed
 - o Rate study (minimum 5-year rate programming to address CIP)
- As stated in the LOIF for the AIA project, contact your Division project manager prior to creating the Scope to discuss how this project helps the Distressed Unit fulfill the statutory requirements in §159G-45(b) and make progress toward de-designation.
- For Distressed Units with an approved or draft Short-Term Action Plan as a result of meeting with Division staff, reference the action items identified in the plan in the project Scope.

Suggested Scope Format (Adobe PDF or other non-editable format)

Section 1 – Reference: Contact information for the grantee, contact information for the consultant, project name as listed in the application and the LOIF, funding cycle, etc.

Section 2 – Narrative: A concise narrative description of the Scope, referencing any applicable historic asset management efforts, describing how the proposed Scope builds on past efforts, and connecting the challenges described in the application with the main project activities.

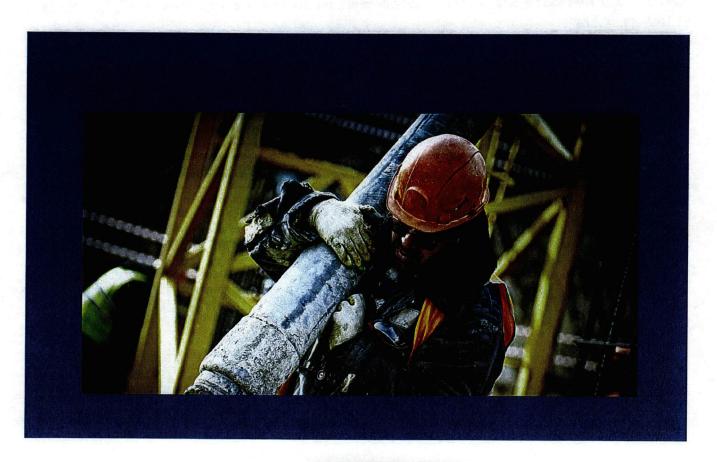
Section 3 – Itemized Tasks: A description, cost, and schedule/timeline of each main project activity, detailed enough that the Division can determine the tasks that will be accomplished during the project, the resulting deliverable, and what is/is not eligible for disbursement.

Section 4 – Deliverables: A summary of the anticipated documents and plans to be created during the project with milestones, including a timeline for the Division to approve the draft and final deliverables, detailed enough that the Division can determine that the grantee will meet the funding requirements.

Preface

Subrecipients received funds from the North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) in the form of subawards, the purpose of which was to carry out a portion of NC DEQ's American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) State Fiscal Recovery Fund (SFRF) grant program in accordance with the applicable law.

As such, Subrecipients must carry out the responsibilities of their subawards in accordance with Section 602 of the Social Security Act (as added by section 9901(a) of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021), 31 C.F.R. Part 35 (U.S. Treasury's "Final Rule"), as well as any guidance provided by U.S. Treasury including, but not limited to, the CSLFRF Compliance and Reporting Guidance and U.S. Treasury's SLFRF Final Rule Frequently Asked Questions. Subrecipients must also comply with the applicable provisions of 2 C.F.R. Part 200 (the "Uniform Guidance"), as implemented by the U.S. Treasury under 2 C.F.R. Part 1000, and as set forth in the CSLFRF Assistance Listing 21.027.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) for Preparing the Preliminary Scopes of Work (Scope) for Asset Inventory and Assessment (AIA) Grants from The Division of Water Infrastructure (Division)

What is a Scope of Work for an AIA project?

- The Division of Water Infrastructure (Division) requires an approved Preliminary Scope of Work (Scope) prior to transmitting the formal Grant Offer to recipients of approved AIA grants (grantees).
- Scopes for AIA projects provide the Division with an overview of the project tasks, costs, timeline, and deliverables/recommendations used to direct disbursements.
- The Scope should be consistent with the activities or services described in the application that will address the challenges experienced by the utility. The scope should be consistent with the scope of work to which the grantee will agree to in an engineering contract.

How do I submit my AIA Scope?

- Scopes should be submitted by the grantee (not the consultant) via the Division's online portal to the Division's project manager identified in the project's Letter of Intent to Fund (LOIF), by the date indicated in the milestone schedule. Reference the Division's Project Number provided in the LOIF.
 - Form to upload documents: <u>https://edocs.deg.nc.gov/Forms/DW-Document-Upload-Form</u>
- The grantee's Authorized Representative (not the consultant) may request a modest extension
 of the submittal date via an email or letter on appropriate letterhead, sent to the Division's
 project manager. The request must include a justification for the delay and propose a new
 date for submitting the Scope.
- Prior to submitting your scope, contact your Division project manager regarding any anticipated changes to the project as described in the application.

What does DWI require in an AIA Scope?

- Scopes must be consistent with the project described in the approved funding application, including the budget and challenges described in the application narrative.
- Scopes must contain the following:
 - Anticipated activities and/or services to be performed during the AIA project
 - A concise narrative describing how each project activity addresses the challenges in the approved AIA application
 - The budget for each project activity
 - A schedule for completing the project within 24 months of the Letter of Intent to Fund
 - The deliverables to be produced for the project, including GIS shape files as applicable to the project

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What are eligible AIA project Activities?

- Project activities should adhere to the Division's "Water and Wastewater Utility Evaluation Guidance Document: Asset Inventory and Assessment, Capital Cost, and Operating Cost Analyses" document, which primarily serves to help guide engineers and consultants during an AIA project. The latest version is posted to the Division's website (here).
- Regardless of eligibility, if the project includes activities NOT covered by the AIA grant, the Scope budget must distinguish (a) the activities (or a portion thereof) that will be funded by the AIA grant from (b) the activities (or a portion thereof) that will be funded outside of the AIA grant.
 - For example, a \$200,000 AIA project may receive \$150,000 in Division AIA grant funding. The budget table in the Scope should show one column for the costs and activities covered by the AIA grant (totaling \$150,000) and a separate column for the costs to be covered by the other funding source (totaling the remaining \$50,000), and also provide the source of the non-Division funding (i.e., local cash, USDA grant, etc.).
- If equipment is an integral part of your project, contact your Division project manager prior to submitting the scope.
 - Eligible equipment costs (tablets, computers, and asset management equipment) must comprise no more than 10 percent of the grant AND must be justified in the scope.
- If access to software is an integral part of your project, the initial purchase and/or subscription is eligible, but the renewal of software subscription is not eligible.

What is required for the Scope narrative?

- The Scope narrative should consist of a succinct discussion of each task. The description should explain how the tasks relate to the challenges and benefits identified in the application.
- Reference any applicable historic asset management work and describe how the proposed project Scope builds upon those past asset management efforts.
- Specify that any GIS data delivered to the grantee will be provided in a format they can easily and readily update with current resources, and clearly identify the owner of the data.
- Remember, the application was funded based on the specific needs of the system and proposed benefits of the AIA project.

What is required for the project schedule?

- The project schedule must show the anticipated start and end dates for each project activity.
- The final project completion date must be within 24 months of the date the Letter of Intent to Fund is sent to the applicant (this language is in the Letter of Intent to Fund). Typically, the Grant Offer will be issued within one month of scope approval.
- Specify that DWI will be copied on draft and final deliverables, including the appropriate GIS data

layers that show a complete service area boundary, including gaps within those boundaries.

 Provide regular (no less frequent than every other month unless otherwise directed by the Division) updates, preferably with the submittal of disbursement requests.

What makes up the Deliverable?

- The deliverable consists of the documents produced by the planning project. The documents may include, but are not limited to:
 - o photos
 - o maps
 - o outputs and summaries of models and/or flow monitoring
 - copies of physical CCTV inspections
 - o GIS data layers if applicable
 - Findings, recommendations, and/or conculsions
- Scopes must specify that both the draft and final deliverables will be submitted to the Division for review and approval prior to processing the final disbursement request.

What deliverables must be submitted to the Division?

- At the end of the AIA project, the grantee must submit to the Division a copy of the deliverable/report, an executive summary, and either:
 - A copy of the board meeting minutes where the report/recommendations were presented and the minutes of the subsequent board meeting showing adoption of the previous meeting's minutes, or
 - A resolution passed by the governing board adopting the findings/recommendations/conclusions presented in the report, including Capital Improvement Plans and adjoining rate studies as appropriate.
- The final report must be approved by the Division prior to final disbursement of the grant funds.
- For projects that develop a new or update an existing GIS database, GIS shapefiles and databases must be submitted to Division staff upon completion of the project. The shapefile should include the appropriate GIS data layers that show a complete service area boundary, including gaps within those boundaries, most commonly in the following file formats: .shp, .shx, and .dbf.
- Note that the data gathered during the Division-funded project is the property of the grantee; exceptions to grantee ownership of project deliverables, including incorporation of data into proprietary software, must be clarified in the scope.

What if my Local Government Unit (Unit) has been designated Distressed?

- Distressed Units are required to complete the activities established in NCGS §159G-45(b), and an AIA grant provides funding to fulfill some of those requirements.
- Remember, project activities should adhere to the Division's guidance document.
- Distressed Units are required to complete short-term and long-term plans for infrastructure

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repair, maintenance, and management, of which a complete AMP and 10-year CIP are integral parts. AIA projects for distressed units must either:

- Result in a complete Asset Management Plan (AMP) including at least a 10-year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP), or
- Establish the basis of an AMP and a timeline for fulfilling all the activities required of distressed units.
- In general, a complete AMP consists of:
 - List of assets/asset registry
 - Spatial database/GIS map
 - A risk-based condition assessment of all water and/or wastewater assets
 - o Minimum 10-year Capital Improvement Plan
 - Recommended schedule and plan for Operation, Maintenance and Rehabilitation/Replacement, including time/cost estimates for annual budgeting
 - Staffing plan to implement AMP/CIP, as needed
 - Rate study (minimum 5-year rate programming to address CIP)
- As stated in the LOIF for the AIA project, contact your Division project manager prior to creating the Scope to discuss how this project helps the Distressed Unit fulfill the statutory requirements in §159G-45(b) and make progress toward de-designation.
- For Distressed Units with an approved or draft Short-Term Action Plan as a result of meeting with Division staff, reference the action items identified in the plan in the project Scope.

Suggested Scope Format (Adobe PDF or other non-editable format)

Section 1 – Reference: Contact information for the grantee, contact information for the consultant, project name as listed in the application and the LOIF, funding cycle, etc.

Section 2 – Narrative: A concise narrative description of the Scope, referencing any applicable historic asset management efforts, describing how the proposed Scope builds on past efforts, and connecting the challenges described in the application with the main project activities.

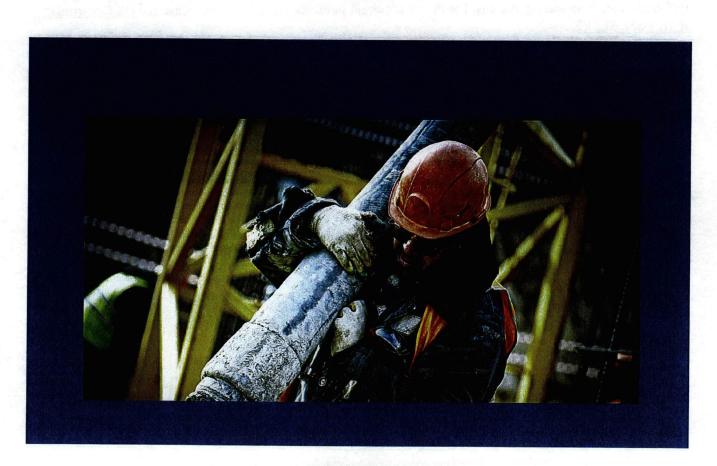
Section 3 – Itemized Tasks: A description, cost, and schedule/timeline of each main project activity, detailed enough that the Division can determine the tasks that will be accomplished during the project, the resulting deliverable, and what is/is not eligible for disbursement.

Section 4 – Deliverables: A summary of the anticipated documents and plans to be created during the project with milestones, including a timeline for the Division to approve the draft and final deliverables, detailed enough that the Division can determine that the grantee will meet the funding requirements.

Preface

Subrecipients received funds from the North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) in the form of subawards, the purpose of which was to carry out a portion of NC DEQ's American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) State Fiscal Recovery Fund (SFRF) grant program in accordance with the applicable law.

As such, Subrecipients must carry out the responsibilities of their subawards in accordance with Section 602 of the Social Security Act (as added by section 9901(a) of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021), 31 C.F.R. Part 35 (U.S. Treasury's "Final Rule"), as well as any guidance provided by U.S. Treasury including, but not limited to, the CSLFRF Compliance and Reporting Guidance and U.S. Treasury's SLFRF Final Rule Frequently Asked Questions. Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) for Preparing the Preliminary Scopes of Work (Scope) for Asset Inventory and Assessment (AIA) Grants from The Division of Water Infrastructure (Division)

What is a Scope of Work for an AIA project?

- The Division of Water Infrastructure (Division) requires an approved Preliminary Scope of Work (Scope) prior to transmitting the formal Grant Offer to recipients of approved AIA grants (grantees).
- Scopes for AIA projects provide the Division with an overview of the project tasks, costs, timeline, and deliverables/recommendations used to direct disbursements.
- The Scope should be consistent with the activities or services described in the application that will address the challenges experienced by the utility. The scope should be consistent with the scope of work to which the grantee will agree to in an engineering contract.

How do I submit my AIA Scope?

- Scopes should be submitted by the grantee (not the consultant) via the Division's online portal to the Division's project manager identified in the project's Letter of Intent to Fund (LOIF), by the date indicated in the milestone schedule. Reference the Division's Project Number provided in the LOIF.

- The grantee's Authorized Representative (not the consultant) may request a modest extension of the submittal date via an email or letter on appropriate letterhead, sent to the Division's project manager. The request must include a justification for the delay and propose a new date for submitting the Scope.
- Prior to submitting your scope, contact your Division project manager regarding any anticipated changes to the project as described in the application.

What does DWI require in an AIA Scope?

- Scopes must be consistent with the project described in the approved funding application, including the budget and challenges described in the application narrative.
- Scopes must contain the following:
 - Anticipated activities and/or services to be performed during the AIA project
 - A concise narrative describing how each project activity addresses the challenges in the approved AIA application
 - The budget for each project activity
 - A schedule for completing the project within 24 months of the Letter of Intent to Fund
 - The deliverables to be produced for the project, including GIS shape files as applicable to the project

What are eligible AIA project Activities?

- Project activities should adhere to the Division's "Water and Wastewater Utility Evaluation Guidance Document: Asset Inventory and Assessment, Capital Cost, and Operating Cost Analyses" document, which primarily serves to help guide engineers and consultants during an AIA project. The latest version is posted to the Division's website (here).
- Regardless of eligibility, if the project includes activities NOT covered by the AIA grant, the Scope budget must distinguish (a) the activities (or a portion thereof) that will be funded by the AIA grant from (b) the activities (or a portion thereof) that will be funded outside of the AIA grant.
 - For example, a \$200,000 AIA project may receive \$150,000 in Division AIA grant funding. The budget table in the Scope should show one column for the costs and activities covered by the AIA grant (totaling \$150,000) and a separate column for the costs to be covered by the other funding source (totaling the remaining \$50,000), and also provide the source of the non-Division funding (i.e., local cash, USDA grant, etc.).
- If equipment is an integral part of your project, contact your Division project manager prior to submitting the scope.
 - Eligible equipment costs (tablets, computers, and asset management equipment) must comprise no more than 10 percent of the grant AND must be justified in the scope.
- If access to software is an integral part of your project, the initial purchase and/or subscription is eligible, but the renewal of software subscription is not eligible.

What is required for the Scope narrative?

- The Scope narrative should consist of a succinct discussion of each task. The description should explain how the tasks relate to the challenges and benefits identified in the application.
- Reference any applicable historic asset management work and describe how the proposed project Scope builds upon those past asset management efforts.
- Specify that any GIS data delivered to the grantee will be provided in a format they can easily and readily update with current resources, and clearly identify the owner of the data.
- Remember, the application was funded based on the specific needs of the system and proposed benefits of the AIA project.

What is required for the project schedule?

- The project schedule must show the anticipated start and end dates for each project activity.
- The final project completion date must be within 24 months of the date the Letter of Intent to Fund is sent to the applicant (this language is in the Letter of Intent to Fund). Typically, the Grant Offer will be issued within one month of scope approval.
- Specify that DWI will be copied on draft and final deliverables, including the appropriate GIS data

layers that show a complete service area boundary, including gaps within those boundaries.

• Provide regular (no less frequent than every other month unless otherwise directed by the Division) updates, preferably with the submittal of disbursement requests.

What makes up the Deliverable?

- The deliverable consists of the documents produced by the planning project. The documents may include, but are not limited to:
 - o photos
 - o maps
 - o outputs and summaries of models and/or flow monitoring
 - copies of physical CCTV inspections
 - o GIS data layers if applicable
 - o Findings, recommendations, and/or conculsions
- Scopes must specify that both the draft and final deliverables will be submitted to the Division for review and approval prior to processing the final disbursement request.

What deliverables must be submitted to the Division?

- At the end of the AIA project, the grantee must submit to the Division a copy of the deliverable/report, an executive summary, and either:
 - A copy of the board meeting minutes where the report/recommendations were presented and the minutes of the subsequent board meeting showing adoption of the previous meeting's minutes, or
 - A resolution passed by the governing board adopting the findings/recommendations/conclusions presented in the report, including Capital Improvement Plans and adjoining rate studies as appropriate.
- The final report must be approved by the Division prior to final disbursement of the grant funds.
- For projects that develop a new or update an existing GIS database, GIS shapefiles and databases must be submitted to Division staff upon completion of the project. The shapefile should include the appropriate GIS data layers that show a complete service area boundary, including gaps within those boundaries, most commonly in the following file formats: .shp, .shx, and .dbf.
- Note that the data gathered during the Division-funded project is the property of the grantee; exceptions to grantee ownership of project deliverables, including incorporation of data into proprietary software, must be clarified in the scope.

What if my Local Government Unit (Unit) has been designated Distressed?

- Distressed Units are required to complete the activities established in NCGS §159G-45(b), and an AIA grant provides funding to fulfill some of those requirements.
- Remember, project activities should adhere to the Division's guidance document.
- Distressed Units are required to complete short-term and long-term plans for infrastructure

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repair, maintenance, and management, of which a complete AMP and 10-year CIP are integral parts. AIA projects for distressed units must either:

- Result in a complete Asset Management Plan (AMP) including at least a 10-year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP), or
- Establish the basis of an AMP and a timeline for fulfilling all the activities required of distressed units.
- In general, a complete AMP consists of:
 - List of assets/asset registry
 - Spatial database/GIS map
 - A risk-based condition assessment of all water and/or wastewater assets
 - o Minimum 10-year Capital Improvement Plan
 - Recommended schedule and plan for Operation, Maintenance and Rehabilitation/Replacement, including time/cost estimates for annual budgeting
 - Staffing plan to implement AMP/CIP, as needed
 - o Rate study (minimum 5-year rate programming to address CIP)
- As stated in the LOIF for the AIA project, contact your Division project manager prior to creating the Scope to discuss how this project helps the Distressed Unit fulfill the statutory requirements in §159G-45(b) and make progress toward de-designation.
- For Distressed Units with an approved or draft Short-Term Action Plan as a result of meeting with Division staff, reference the action items identified in the plan in the project Scope.

Suggested Scope Format (Adobe PDF or other non-editable format)

Section 1 – Reference: Contact information for the grantee, contact information for the consultant, project name as listed in the application and the LOIF, funding cycle, etc.

Section 2 – Narrative: A concise narrative description of the Scope, referencing any applicable historic asset management efforts, describing how the proposed Scope builds on past efforts, and connecting the challenges described in the application with the main project activities.

Section 3 – Itemized Tasks: A description, cost, and schedule/timeline of each main project activity, detailed enough that the Division can determine the tasks that will be accomplished during the project, the resulting deliverable, and what is/is not eligible for disbursement.

Section 4 – Deliverables: A summary of the anticipated documents and plans to be created during the project with milestones, including a timeline for the Division to approve the draft and final deliverables, detailed enough that the Division can determine that the grantee will meet the funding requirements.

Preface

Subrecipients received funds from the North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) in the form of subawards, the purpose of which was to carry out a portion of NC DEQ's American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) State Fiscal Recovery Fund (SFRF) grant program in accordance with the applicable law.

As such, Subrecipients must carry out the responsibilities of their subawards in accordance with Section 602 of the Social Security Act (as added by section 9901(a) of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021), 31 C.F.R. Part 35 (U.S. Treasury's "Final Rule"), as well as any guidance provided by U.S. Treasury including, but not limited to, the CSLFRF Compliance and Reporting Guidance and U.S. Treasury's SLFRF Final Rule Frequently Asked Questions. Subrecipients must also comply with the applicable provisions of 2 C.F.R. Part 200 (the "Uniform Guidance"), as implemented by the U.S. Treasury under 2 C.F.R. Part 1000, and as set forth in the CSLFRF Assistance Listing 21.027.

In addition to the federal requirements for ARPA/SFRF subawards, subrecipients must also comply with applicable state laws and regulations. For the most current guidance from Treasury, please see <u>US Department</u> of <u>Treasury_SLFRF</u>.

### Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) for Preparing the Preliminary Scopes of Work (Scope) for Asset Inventory and Assessment (AIA) Grants from The Division of Water Infrastructure (Division)

#### What is a Scope of Work for an AIA project?

- The Division of Water Infrastructure (Division) requires an approved Preliminary Scope of Work (Scope) prior to transmitting the formal Grant Offer to recipients of approved AIA grants (grantees).
- Scopes for AIA projects provide the Division with an overview of the project tasks, costs, timeline, and deliverables/recommendations used to direct disbursements.
- The Scope should be consistent with the activities or services described in the application that will address the challenges experienced by the utility. The scope should be consistent with the scope of work to which the grantee will agree to in an engineering contract.

#### How do I submit my AIA Scope?

- Scopes should be submitted by the grantee (not the consultant) via the Division's online portal to the Division's project manager identified in the project's Letter of Intent to Fund (LOIF), by the date indicated in the milestone schedule. Reference the Division's Project Number provided in the LOIF.
  - Form to upload documents: <u>https://edocs.deg.nc.gov/Forms/DW-Document-Upload-Form</u>
- The grantee's Authorized Representative (not the consultant) may request a modest extension of the submittal date via an email or letter on appropriate letterhead, sent to the Division's project manager. The request must include a justification for the delay and propose a new date for submitting the Scope.
- Prior to submitting your scope, contact your Division project manager regarding any anticipated changes to the project as described in the application.

## What does DWI require in an AIA Scope?

- Scopes must be consistent with the project described in the approved funding application, including the budget and challenges described in the application narrative.
- Scopes must contain the following:
  - Anticipated activities and/or services to be performed during the AIA project
  - A concise narrative describing how each project activity addresses the challenges in the approved AIA application
  - The budget for each project activity
  - A schedule for completing the project within 24 months of the Letter of Intent to Fund
  - The deliverables to be produced for the project, including GIS shape files as applicable to the project

#### What are eligible AIA project Activities?

- Project activities should adhere to the Division's "Water and Wastewater Utility Evaluation Guidance Document: Asset Inventory and Assessment, Capital Cost, and Operating Cost Analyses" document, which primarily serves to help guide engineers and consultants during an AIA project. The latest version is posted to the Division's website (here).
- Regardless of eligibility, if the project includes activities NOT covered by the AIA grant, the Scope budget must distinguish (a) the activities (or a portion thereof) that will be funded by the AIA grant from (b) the activities (or a portion thereof) that will be funded outside of the AIA grant.
  - For example, a \$200,000 AIA project may receive \$150,000 in Division AIA grant funding. The budget table in the Scope should show one column for the costs and activities covered by the AIA grant (totaling \$150,000) and a separate column for the costs to be covered by the other funding source (totaling the remaining \$50,000), and also provide the source of the non-Division funding (i.e., local cash, USDA grant, etc.).
- If equipment is an integral part of your project, contact your Division project manager prior to submitting the scope.
  - Eligible equipment costs (tablets, computers, and asset management equipment) must comprise no more than 10 percent of the grant AND must be justified in the scope.
- If access to software is an integral part of your project, the initial purchase and/or subscription is eligible, but the renewal of software subscription is not eligible.

#### What is required for the Scope narrative?

- The Scope narrative should consist of a succinct discussion of each task. The description should explain how the tasks relate to the challenges and benefits identified in the application.
- Reference any applicable historic asset management work and describe how the proposed project Scope builds upon those past asset management efforts.
- Specify that any GIS data delivered to the grantee will be provided in a format they can easily
  and readily update with current resources, and clearly identify the owner of the data.
- Remember, the application was funded based on the specific needs of the system and proposed benefits of the AIA project.

#### What is required for the project schedule?

- The project schedule must show the anticipated start and end dates for each project activity.
- The final project completion date must be within 24 months of the date the Letter of Intent to Fund is sent to the applicant (this language is in the Letter of Intent to Fund). Typically, the Grant Offer will be issued within one month of scope approval.
- Specify that DWI will be copied on draft and final deliverables, including the appropriate GIS data

layers that show a complete service area boundary, including gaps within those boundaries.

• Provide regular (no less frequent than every other month unless otherwise directed by the Division) updates, preferably with the submittal of disbursement requests.

#### What makes up the Deliverable?

- The deliverable consists of the documents produced by the planning project. The documents may include, but are not limited to:
  - o photos
  - o maps
  - o outputs and summaries of models and/or flow monitoring
  - o copies of physical CCTV inspections
  - o GIS data layers if applicable
  - Findings, recommendations, and/or conculsions
- Scopes must specify that both the draft and final deliverables will be submitted to the Division for review and approval prior to processing the final disbursement request.

#### What deliverables must be submitted to the Division?

- At the end of the AIA project, the grantee must submit to the Division a copy of the deliverable/report, an executive summary, and either:
  - A copy of the board meeting minutes where the report/recommendations were presented and the minutes of the subsequent board meeting showing adoption of the previous meeting's minutes, or
  - A resolution passed by the governing board adopting the findings/recommendations/conclusions presented in the report, including Capital Improvement Plans and adjoining rate studies as appropriate.
- The final report must be approved by the Division prior to final disbursement of the grant funds.
- For projects that develop a new or update an existing GIS database, GIS shapefiles and databases must be submitted to Division staff upon completion of the project. The shapefile should include the appropriate GIS data layers that show a complete service area boundary, including gaps within those boundaries, most commonly in the following file formats: .shp, .shx, and .dbf.
- Note that the data gathered during the Division-funded project is the property of the grantee; exceptions to grantee ownership of project deliverables, including incorporation of data into proprietary software, must be clarified in the scope.

#### What if my Local Government Unit (Unit) has been designated Distressed?

- Distressed Units are required to complete the activities established in NCGS §159G-45(b), and an AIA grant provides funding to fulfill some of those requirements.
- Remember, project activities should adhere to the Division's guidance document.
- Distressed Units are required to complete short-term and long-term plans for infrastructure

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repair, maintenance, and management, of which a complete AMP and 10-year CIP are integral parts. AIA projects for distressed units must either:

- Result in a complete Asset Management Plan (AMP) including at least a 10-year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP), or
- Establish the basis of an AMP and a timeline for fulfilling all the activities required of distressed units.
- In general, a complete AMP consists of:
  - List of assets/asset registry
  - Spatial database/GIS map
  - A risk-based condition assessment of all water and/or wastewater assets
  - o Minimum 10-year Capital Improvement Plan
  - Recommended schedule and plan for Operation, Maintenance and Rehabilitation/Replacement, including time/cost estimates for annual budgeting
  - Staffing plan to implement AMP/CIP, as needed
  - Rate study (minimum 5-year rate programming to address CIP)
- As stated in the LOIF for the AIA project, contact your Division project manager prior to creating the Scope to discuss how this project helps the Distressed Unit fulfill the statutory requirements in §159G-45(b) and make progress toward de-designation.
- For Distressed Units with an approved or draft Short-Term Action Plan as a result of meeting with Division staff, reference the action items identified in the plan in the project Scope.

#### Suggested Scope Format (Adobe PDF or other non-editable format)

**Section 1 – Reference:** Contact information for the grantee, contact information for the consultant, project name as listed in the application and the LOIF, funding cycle, etc.

**Section 2 – Narrative**: A concise narrative description of the Scope, referencing any applicable historic asset management efforts, describing how the proposed Scope builds on past efforts, and connecting the challenges described in the application with the main project activities.

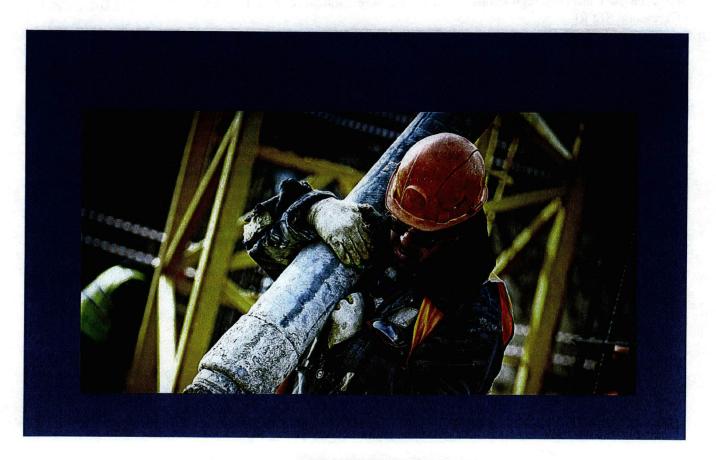
**Section 3 – Itemized Tasks:** A description, cost, and schedule/timeline of each main project activity, detailed enough that the Division can determine the tasks that will be accomplished during the project, the resulting deliverable, and what is/is not eligible for disbursement.

**Section 4 – Deliverables:** A summary of the anticipated documents and plans to be created during the project with milestones, including a timeline for the Division to approve the draft and final deliverables, detailed enough that the Division can determine that the grantee will meet the funding requirements.

# Preface

Subrecipients received funds from the North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) in the form of subawards, the purpose of which was to carry out a portion of NC DEQ's American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) State Fiscal Recovery Fund (SFRF) grant program in accordance with the applicable law.

As such, Subrecipients must carry out the responsibilities of their subawards in accordance with Section 602 of the Social Security Act (as added by section 9901(a) of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021), 31 C.F.R. Part 35 (U.S. Treasury's "Final Rule"), as well as any guidance provided by U.S. Treasury including, but not limited to, the CSLFRF Compliance and Reporting Guidance and U.S. Treasury's SLFRF Final Rule Frequently Asked Questions. #### Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) for Preparing the Preliminary Scopes of Work (Scope) for Asset Inventory and Assessment (AIA) Grants from The Division of Water Infrastructure (Division)

#### What is a Scope of Work for an AIA project?

- The Division of Water Infrastructure (Division) requires an approved Preliminary Scope of Work (Scope) prior to transmitting the formal Grant Offer to recipients of approved AIA grants (grantees).
- Scopes for AIA projects provide the Division with an overview of the project tasks, costs, timeline, and deliverables/recommendations used to direct disbursements.
- The Scope should be consistent with the activities or services described in the application that will address the challenges experienced by the utility. The scope should be consistent with the scope of work to which the grantee will agree to in an engineering contract.

#### How do I submit my AIA Scope?

- Scopes should be submitted by the grantee (not the consultant) via the Division's online portal to the Division's project manager identified in the project's Letter of Intent to Fund (LOIF), by the date indicated in the milestone schedule. Reference the Division's Project Number provided in the LOIF.
  - Form to upload documents: <u>https://edocs.deg.nc.gov/Forms/DW-Document-Upload-Form</u>
- The grantee's Authorized Representative (not the consultant) may request a modest extension of the submittal date via an email or letter on appropriate letterhead, sent to the Division's project manager. The request must include a justification for the delay and propose a new date for submitting the Scope.
- Prior to submitting your scope, contact your Division project manager regarding any anticipated changes to the project as described in the application.

#### What does DWI require in an AIA Scope?

- Scopes must be consistent with the project described in the approved funding application, including the budget and challenges described in the application narrative.
- Scopes must contain the following:
  - Anticipated activities and/or services to be performed during the AIA project
  - A concise narrative describing how each project activity addresses the challenges in the approved AIA application
  - The budget for each project activity
  - A schedule for completing the project within 24 months of the Letter of Intent to Fund
  - The deliverables to be produced for the project, including GIS shape files as applicable to the project

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#### What are eligible AIA project Activities?

- Project activities should adhere to the Division's "Water and Wastewater Utility Evaluation Guidance Document: Asset Inventory and Assessment, Capital Cost, and Operating Cost Analyses" document, which primarily serves to help guide engineers and consultants during an AIA project. The latest version is posted to the Division's website (here).
- Regardless of eligibility, if the project includes activities NOT covered by the AIA grant, the Scope budget must distinguish (a) the activities (or a portion thereof) that will be funded by the AIA grant from (b) the activities (or a portion thereof) that will be funded outside of the AIA grant.
  - For example, a \$200,000 AIA project may receive \$150,000 in Division AIA grant funding. The budget table in the Scope should show one column for the costs and activities covered by the AIA grant (totaling \$150,000) and a separate column for the costs to be covered by the other funding source (totaling the remaining \$50,000), and also provide the source of the non-Division funding (i.e., local cash, USDA grant, etc.).
- If equipment is an integral part of your project, contact your Division project manager prior to submitting the scope.
  - Eligible equipment costs (tablets, computers, and asset management equipment) must comprise no more than 10 percent of the grant AND must be justified in the scope.
- If access to software is an integral part of your project, the initial purchase and/or subscription is eligible, but the renewal of software subscription is not eligible.

#### What is required for the Scope narrative?

- The Scope narrative should consist of a succinct discussion of each task. The description should explain how the tasks relate to the challenges and benefits identified in the application.
- Reference any applicable historic asset management work and describe how the proposed project Scope builds upon those past asset management efforts.
- Specify that any GIS data delivered to the grantee will be provided in a format they can easily and readily update with current resources, and clearly identify the owner of the data.
- Remember, the application was funded based on the specific needs of the system and proposed benefits of the AIA project.

#### What is required for the project schedule?

- The project schedule must show the anticipated start and end dates for each project activity.
- The final project completion date must be within 24 months of the date the Letter of Intent to Fund is sent to the applicant (this language is in the Letter of Intent to Fund). Typically, the Grant Offer will be issued within one month of scope approval.
- Specify that DWI will be copied on draft and final deliverables, including the appropriate GIS data

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layers that show a complete service area boundary, including gaps within those boundaries.

• Provide regular (no less frequent than every other month unless otherwise directed by the Division) updates, preferably with the submittal of disbursement requests.

#### What makes up the Deliverable?

- The deliverable consists of the documents produced by the planning project. The documents may include, but are not limited to:
  - o photos
  - o maps
  - o outputs and summaries of models and/or flow monitoring
  - o copies of physical CCTV inspections
  - o GIS data layers if applicable
  - Findings, recommendations, and/or conculsions
- Scopes must specify that both the draft and final deliverables will be submitted to the Division for review and approval prior to processing the final disbursement request.

#### What deliverables must be submitted to the Division?

- At the end of the AIA project, the grantee must submit to the Division a copy of the deliverable/report, an executive summary, and either:
  - A copy of the board meeting minutes where the report/recommendations were presented and the minutes of the subsequent board meeting showing adoption of the previous meeting's minutes, or
  - A resolution passed by the governing board adopting the findings/recommendations/conclusions presented in the report, including Capital Improvement Plans and adjoining rate studies as appropriate.
- The final report must be approved by the Division prior to final disbursement of the grant funds.
- For projects that develop a new or update an existing GIS database, GIS shapefiles and databases must be submitted to Division staff upon completion of the project. The shapefile should include the appropriate GIS data layers that show a complete service area boundary, including gaps within those boundaries, most commonly in the following file formats: .shp, .shx, and .dbf.
- Note that the data gathered during the Division-funded project is the property of the grantee; exceptions to grantee ownership of project deliverables, including incorporation of data into proprietary software, must be clarified in the scope.

#### What if my Local Government Unit (Unit) has been designated Distressed?

- Distressed Units are required to complete the activities established in NCGS §159G-45(b), and an AIA grant provides funding to fulfill some of those requirements.
- Remember, project activities should adhere to the Division's guidance document.
- Distressed Units are required to complete short-term and long-term plans for infrastructure

repair, maintenance, and management, of which a complete AMP and 10-year CIP are integral parts. AIA projects for distressed units must either:

- Result in a complete Asset Management Plan (AMP) including at least a 10-year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP), or
- Establish the basis of an AMP and a timeline for fulfilling all the activities required of distressed units.
- In general, a complete AMP consists of:
  - List of assets/asset registry
  - o Spatial database/GIS map
  - o A risk-based condition assessment of all water and/or wastewater assets
  - o Minimum 10-year Capital Improvement Plan
  - Recommended schedule and plan for Operation, Maintenance and Rehabilitation/Replacement, including time/cost estimates for annual budgeting
  - o Staffing plan to implement AMP/CIP, as needed
  - Rate study (minimum 5-year rate programming to address CIP)
- As stated in the LOIF for the AIA project, contact your Division project manager prior to creating the Scope to discuss how this project helps the Distressed Unit fulfill the statutory requirements in §159G-45(b) and make progress toward de-designation.
- For Distressed Units with an approved or draft Short-Term Action Plan as a result of meeting with Division staff, reference the action items identified in the plan in the project Scope.

#### Suggested Scope Format (Adobe PDF or other non-editable format)

**Section 1 – Reference**: Contact information for the grantee, contact information for the consultant, project name as listed in the application and the LOIF, funding cycle, etc.

**Section 2 – Narrative**: A concise narrative description of the Scope, referencing any applicable historic asset management efforts, describing how the proposed Scope builds on past efforts, and connecting the challenges described in the application with the main project activities.

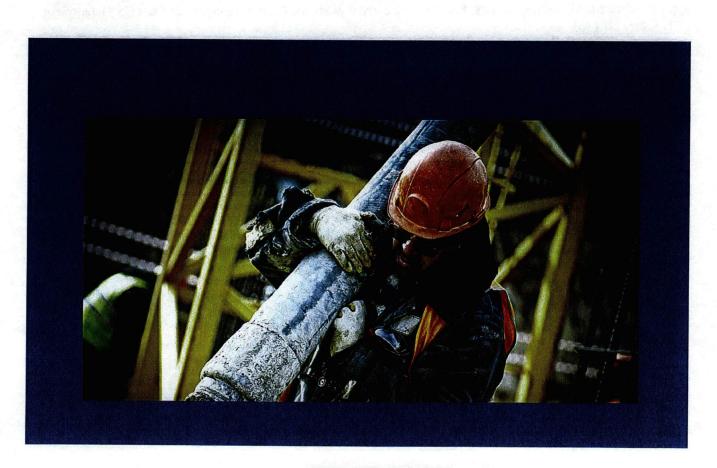
**Section 3 – Itemized Tasks:** A description, cost, and schedule/timeline of each main project activity, detailed enough that the Division can determine the tasks that will be accomplished during the project, the resulting deliverable, and what is/is not eligible for disbursement.

**Section 4 – Deliverables**: A summary of the anticipated documents and plans to be created during the project with milestones, including a timeline for the Division to approve the draft and final deliverables, detailed enough that the Division can determine that the grantee will meet the funding requirements.

# Preface

Subrecipients received funds from the North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) in the form of subawards, the purpose of which was to carry out a portion of NC DEQ's American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) State Fiscal Recovery Fund (SFRF) grant program in accordance with the applicable law.

As such, Subrecipients must carry out the responsibilities of their subawards in accordance with Section 602 of the Social Security Act (as added by section 9901(a) of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021), 31 C.F.R. Part 35 (U.S. Treasury's "Final Rule"), as well as any guidance provided by U.S. Treasury including, but not limited to, the CSLFRF Compliance and Reporting Guidance and U.S. Treasury's SLFRF Final Rule Frequently Asked Questions. Subrecipients must also comply with the applicable provisions of 2 C.F.R. Part 200 (the "Uniform Guidance"), as implemented by the U.S. Treasury under 2 C.F.R. Part 1000, and as set forth in the CSLFRF Assistance Listing 21.027.

In addition to the federal requirements for ARPA/SFRF subawards, subrecipients must also comply with applicable state laws and regulations. For the most current guidance from Treasury, please see <u>US Department of Treasury_SLFRF</u>.

Pursuant to its responsibilities as a pass-through entity for federal financial assistance, NC DEQ created this document to serve as a quick reference guide regarding the requirements applicable to subrecipients. Subrecipients are responsible for properly complying with all applicable federal, state, and local requirements as they carry out their duties under their subawards.
